A compliance professional should be able to use what is taught in this course to design an adequate structure to facilitate an effective compliance program.

1:15 – 2:45 PM	Standards, Policies, and Procedures  Compliance-related policies which are current to—and meet the intent of—regulatory requirements and organizational expectations are the cornerstone of an effective compliance program. They provide staff with operational guidance on dealing with compliance related functions and provide the structure to establish a working program as well as a mechanism to initiate a periodic review of such policies related to compliance with applicable regulatory requirements. Understanding the differences between policy and procedures—as well as what are the essential components of compliance policies—also assists the participant in developing, implementing, and evaluating the adequacy of their compliance program policies.
